"Restoring a Right Relationship With Christ"

John 21:15-25

SERMON SUMMARY

Many of us have been filled by guilt and shame because of our sin. In this text we see Jesus' kindness and tenderness towards Peter through the way He poses the three questions to Peter and the way He responds to Peter's answers. What we see in this passage then is the heart of Jesus for Peter and for all us. Jesus is ready not only to forgive Peter, but also to reaffirm His calling in Peter's life and to restore him to ministry.

Suggested Questions for Students and Kids

- 1. How many times does Jesus ask Peter whether Peter loves Him?
- 2. How does Peter respond?
- 3. What does Jesus say after each one of Peter's responses?
- 4. What does this passage tell you about Jesus?

Suggested Questions for Adults

1.	Why do you think Jesus asks Peter three times whether or not Peter loves him?
2.	How does Peter respond to Jesus every time? What do you think was going on in Peter's mind when he heard each one of these questions?
3.	What did Jesus command Peter to do?
4.	How does Jesus reply to Peter's answers?
5.	Peter wants to find out answers to questions pertaining to the other disciples' future, but Jesus refuses to answer Peter. Why do you think he does that?
6.	What are some things that the Lord spoke to you through the sermon this morning?

Weekly Prayer Focus
